

#### **Grapheme Card Deck**

Structured Literacy lessons include activities and explicit instructional routines for introducing and reinforcing phoneme-grapheme correspondences. These routines ensure that instruction explicitly and systematically engages students' major learning modalities or pathways - auditory, visual, and tactile-kinesthetic. These lessons typically include the use of a grapheme card deck during such activities. Various Structured Literacy programs may have their own unique grapheme card decks aligned to their product. This grapheme card deck is provided for teachers who may need to download, print, and assemble a generic card deck to use with students.

On the following pages, you will find three groups of cards:

- Grapheme Cards with single letters or letter combinations that represent single phonemes
- **Consonant Blend Cards** with a combination of two to three consonant graphemes that each represent a separate speech sound
- Optional: Common Pattern Cards with grapheme combinations often taught as common word patterns

The cards are numbered for assembly purposes only. The numbers do not indicate or correspond to a sequence of instruction. The numbers can be helpful to teachers when arranging the cards into alphabetical order.

#### Materials:

White Cardstock Yellow Cardstock Scissors or Paper Cutter

**Instructions:** In order to create your own Grapheme Card Deck:

- 1. Set the printer/copier to print double-sided and print the full card deck template.
- 2. Divide the Grapheme Card, Consonant Blend Card, and Common Pattern Card pages.
  - a. Print each page of the Grapheme Cards double-sided on white cardstock.
  - b. Print each page of the Consonant Blend Cards double-sided on pink cardstock.
  - c. Print each page of the Common Pattern Cards double-sided on yellow cardstock.
- 3. Following the template, cut each page into the four cards.
- 4. Assemble the Grapheme Card Deck by placing the Grapheme Cards in alphabetical order, the Consonant Blend Cards in numerical order, followed by the Common Pattern Cards, if you chose to print those.




